Workshop offer to schools and youth centers

My Participation Revolution: Engage! Connect! Empower!

Das von Südwind geleitete Projekt unterstützt als Teil des EU-CERV (Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values)-Programms junge Leute aus verschiedenen

Lebensweiten und Ländern bei der Aneignung von Wissen und Kompetenzen auf ihrem Weg, politisch engagierte und aktive Bürgerinnen mit Bewusstsein für ihre europäische identität zu werden.

Dabei stehen die zukunftsweisenden ideen der Jugendlichen und ihre Erwartungen an die europäische Politik im Vordergrund. Südwind unterstützt ihr Engagement und begleitet sie bei der Formulierung ihrer Wühsche.



In den kosteniosen "My Revolution"-Workshops erfahren Jugendliche relevante Fakten über die EU, ihre fundamentalen Rechte, die Wahlen zum Europäischen Parlament und warum politische Beteiligung wichtig ist. Der zweite Teil des Workshops legt den Fokus auf die Anliegen der Teilnehmer:Innen. Mittels kreativer und interaktiver Methoden werden folgende Fragen behandelt:

"Welche sozialen, politischen und wirtschaftlichen Veränderungen forderst du?"

"Wofür möchtest du dich lokal, national, in Europa und global engagieren?"

Die zur Sprache gebrachten Themen werden diskutiert und gesammeit, um in den folgenden nationalen und internationalen Jugendkonferenzen als Grundlage für das "Europäische Jugend-Manifest" zu dienen, das zu Projektende Abgeordneten im Europäischen Parlament in Brüssel präsentiert wird.

Nationale Konferenz (1 Tag)

40 österreichische Jugendliche haben einen ganzen Tag lang die Möglichkeit, die in den lokalen Workshops behandelten Themen im kreativen Weltcafe – Setting miteinander zu diskutieren und für die Bearbeitung in den Internationalen Konferenzen vorzubereiten. Auch ein virtuelles Kenneniemen von Projekt-Teilnehmerinnen aus den anderen Ländern Italien, Polen oder Slowenien steht auf dem Programm.

Europäische Konferenzen in Wien und Bologna (je 3 Tage)

80 Jugendliche – je 20 aus Österreich, Italien, Slowenien und Polen, begleitet von ihren Lehrer innen bzw. Jugendarbeiter:innen - beschäftigen sich zuerst in Wien und wenige Monate später in Bologna mit den für sie vorrangigen Themen aus den vier nationalen Konferenzen. Kreative Methoden wie Digital Storyteiling, Comics, Fotografie und Video sowie Weit-Cafe-Runden werden eingesetzt, um sich künstlerisch und inhaltlich mit den Forderungen auseinanderzusetzen und gemeinsam für das Jugend-Manifest zu erarbeiten.

E-Democracy Portal

Um zwischen den europäischen Konferenzen an ihren Forderungen welterarbeiten zu können und informelle Abstimmungen abhalten zu können, vernetzen sich die Jugendlichen im E-Democracy Portal online weiter.

Direkt im Anschluss an die zweite europäische Konferenz lemen die Jungen Teilnehmer:Innen über die EU-Politik und Ihre Interessensvertretungen und werden auf die Präsentation des Manifests in Brüssei vorbereitet.

Studienreise nach Brüssel (3,5 Tage)

32 Jugendliche – je 8 aus jedem telinehmenden Land – besuchen demokratiepolitisch reievante institutionen, iemen die Stadt bei einer Stadtführung kennen und bekommen die einmalige Gelegenheit zur Präsentation und Diskussion ihrer ideen im EU-Parlament.



HAK Ungargasse (1030 Vienna), which is an inclusive school offering special assistance to students with physical disabilities:








AHS Wenzgasse (1130 Vienna), which offers a special subject called "political participation" for particularly interested students:

Sex-disaggregated data on the participation

The students participating are 14 to 17 years old. In total 58 girls, 45 boys and one student declaring him/herself as non binary participated in the workshops.

Workshop demands and documentation

Each workshop lasted for two hours. First the brochure "Ein kurzer Leitfaden zur EU" (published by the European Commission) was handed out to every student (printed version):

Having been given an input about the Charta of the European Union and its main institutions, focussing on the European Parliament and it's upcoming elections in 2024 and discussing the possibilities of political participation for young people, the students were asked to fill in a Mentimeter asking the following two questions:

What does the European Union mean to you?

What issues should the European Union focus on more in the future? Here are examples of the outcome:






In the following session the students formed groups and each group selected one of the topics below to work on, answering the following question:

Regarding the general topic you have chosen from the list below, which subtopics come to your mind which you think the European Union should work on?




The use of the world café method allowed the students to rotate in the classroom from one issue to another and thus put down their ideas on more than one topic.

A short presentation by every group on their results completed this part of the workshop. Instead of producing written posters like he students of the other four schools, the students of the art-class of HTL Spengergasse where asked to draw their ideas regarding the topics provided. Additionally, they were asked to place hashtags. Here are some of their works:



Which of the following issues would you most like to deal with at the national and international conferences?



As the examples above show, there is only very little coherence in the rankings of the students of different schools.

Counting all the voices separately, there is most interest in the issue of education, followed by the topic of human rights, political participation, media and democracy, the topic of environmental protection, animal rights and climate crises coming in third.

Additionally, the students were asked to name other topics they think highly important for being focussed on by politicians of the European Union in the future. Here is an example:



Some students mentioned that they would miss the topic "digital change", so this topic will be added to the seven topics for the National conference.

Some students mentioned that they wanted to work on "animal rights" not only as a part of the environmental topic, but more specifically, so this topic will also be added as a seperate one for the National conference.

Workshop Evaluations

Finally the students where asked for general feedback on the workshop, overall the acceptance was excellent:

The students where verbally asked by their teachers how many students wanted to participate in the following national and European conferences in order to keep on working on the issues. The number of interested students is overwhelming throughout all five schools and exceeds the number of places available by far.
