The project

The EU education project "Get up and Goals!" CSO-LA/2017/388-124 has been implemented by Südwind Tirol since the beginning of 2018. In September 2015, all 193 member states adopted the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at the United Nations General Assembly. For the first time, countries of the global South and the global North have committed themselves to working together towards comprehensive goals. In Austria, all federal ministries were mandated to implement the 17 goals by a decision of the Council of Ministers in January 2016.
